Ludwigslust becomes climate-neutral and sustainable

To mitigate the effects for future generations, there is not much time left. We should be climate-neutral by 2035 at the latest. The city can and must make a significant contribution with its energy policy. Renewable electricity and heat supply guarantee low prices, independence, and relieve you from private investments. That's why I want to address the following points:

- Establishment of a district heating network through geothermal energy and large heat pumps
- Expansion of municipal electricity production through wind and solar power
- Installation of photovoltaic canopies over parking lots
- Promotion of waste reduction, recycling, and upcycling
- Deciphering paved areas and generous tree planting
- Development of a municipal heat protection plan

- Participation opportunities like citizen surveys and referendums

The mobility of tomorrow. Clean, quiet, and barrier-free

Mobility plays a significant role in people's lives. How do I get to work, school, the doctor, or to friends and family? Ludwigslust is well connected to long-distance transportation, whether by train or car. Nevertheless, the city suffers from high inner-city traffic, diminishing its attractiveness and affecting the health and well-being of its residents. Solutions for future mobility are urgently needed. Therefore, I want to:

- Implement an extensive traffic concept with traffic-calmed zones
- Implement accessible pedestrian crossings and more crosswalks
- Expand and renovate bike paths
- Establish a comprehensive charging infrastructure for electric cars
- Advocate for the expansion of public transport and the railway system

Facing the demographic change head-on

Our population is getting older, with over 50% of Ludwigslust's residents already being over 50 years old. With the retirement of the baby boomer generation in the coming years, the existing skilled labor shortage will intensify significantly. The city must focus on motivating young people to stay and attracting new residents. This can be achieved through:

- A focus on future technologies in economic policy
- Support for sustainable startups
- Free and healthy meals in daycare and schools
- A wide range of sports and leisure activities and the construction of a swimming pool
- Increased funding for youth work.
